The awards ceremony may also be moved to the Macbride Auditorium depending on the number of attendees. Please ask the docents at the front desk at Old Capitol Museum for updates.

Important Event Notes

- Students should know their registration number - they will need it to locate their table or room.
- The general break-rooms for all students, parents, and teachers is Room 40 of Schaeffer Hall and Macbride Hall Auditorium. There will be a large amount of down time—students are encouraged to bring books or games to fill the time.

Category-Specific Notes

Exhibits:

- Students requiring electricity for their displays must bring their own extension cord.
- Students entering exhibits are expected to arrive at the Old Capitol Museum at 8:30 a.m. to setup. 45 minutes will be allowed for exhibit setup.
- PLEASE NOTE***Students with exhibits will be expected to leave the judging area once their interview has taken place. Any students that are in the judging area for more than 5 minutes before or after their allotted judging time will be asked to leave the judging area. Teachers and visitors are not allowed in the judging area while exhibit judging is occurring.
- All exhibits must be dismantled and promptly removed following the awards ceremony.
- There is a second round of judging in the exhibit category. Students are NOT present for this round of judging; however, exhibits must remain on display until the second round is over.

Documentaries: Students do not need to bring their own device for showing a documentary. A TV/projection screen and a computer or DVD player will be provided. Please test your documentary on several platforms to ensure it plays. Bring back-ups! Performances: Students must provide all props to be used in their performances, including tables and chairs. Performance judging rooms are classroom-size; please do not plan on a large stage.
